DuBrow has exhibited his show, "The Living Carousel," at the New England Carousel Museum in 2004. His next museum show, "The Ancient Jewish Cemetery of Prague," will open in 2006.

Sarah Hurwitz is a Phoenix resident, and a recent graduate from the University of Colorado. Hurwitz first focused on creating brightly-colored pop art acrylic images, but has since turned to multi-media works. Her current pieces focus on images that relate to American history, women's history, and how Americans began to represent themselves and the things around them visually in the early 20th Century.
