Watercolors exhibit and reception today

An Invitational Watercolor Exhibit will open today at Camelback Galleries, Scottsdale with a 2 to 6 p.m. reception to meet the artists. Included are the works of seven Arizona women artists: Ruth Blomeyer, Maryl Hones, Isabelle Holt, Jeanette Madden, Harriet Muller, Grace Schooner and Marguerite Seeds. The exhibit will continue at the Camelback Galleries through Dec. 20, though the gallery will be closed Dec. 23 through Dec. 25.

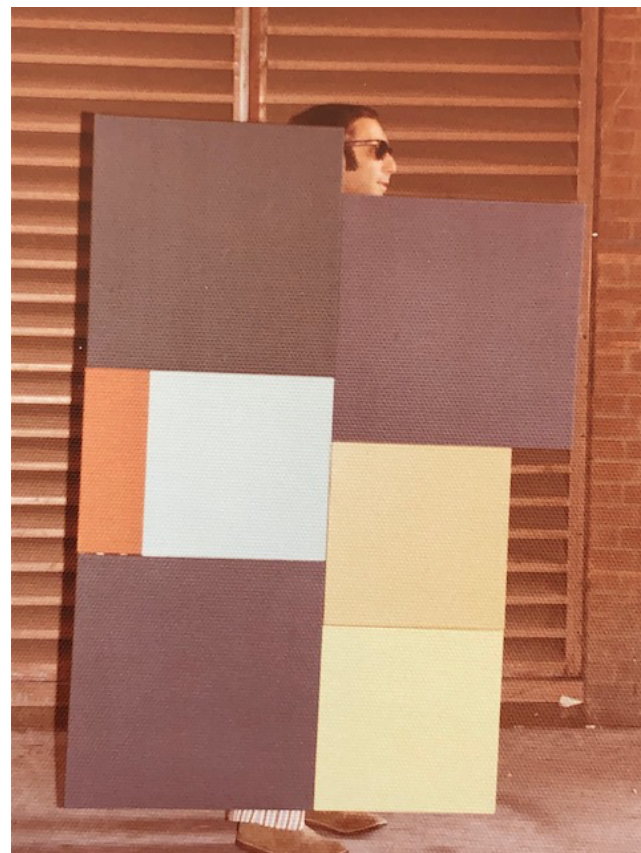
